#### THE COMMITTEE ON MISSION AND WITNESS

RE Juana Tunison (Horseheads, First), presented the report.

Juana Tunison shared news about the Presbyterian Peacemaker visit of the Rev. Doctora Marielis Barreto-Hernandez. Rev. Dr. Barreto-Hernandez enjoyed her visit to the area because of the wonderful fellowship she experienced with several congregations and communities. If anyone would like a copy of the sermon she gave on World Communion Sunday can send a message to Juana Tunison.

Over the past few years, the Presbyterian Mission Agency (PMA) and the Office of the General Assembly (OGA) have been reorganizing to become one unified entity (at present, called the Interim Unified Agency (IUA)). One of the unfortunate results of the unification process is that the Presbyterian Peacemaking Program was officially closed on November 1, 2024. While peacemaking work will still be done in various ways by the denomination, the program as we have known it has ended.

#### **WORSHIP AND THE LORD'S SUPPER**

The Presbytery of Geneva engaged in a service of worship – including the celebration of the Lord's Supper – with TE Lynn Rubier-Capron (Elmira, First) preaching and presiding. The worship service featured improvisational jazz music by the Swing Street Sextet. Other participants in the service included: TE Aaron Frank (Horseheads, First), TE Evan Hansen (Elmira, North), TE Sabrina Slater (Spencer, Christ the King Fellowship), and TE Denise Stone (Big Flats, First).

#### COMMITTEE ON OPERATIONS AND TREASURER'S REPORT

TE David Ashby (AL), Treasurer, and RE Sandra Ansley (Geneva), Committee on Operations' Chairperson, presented the report.

Sandra Ansley reported that the Presbytery of Geneva will be contracting with North Presbyterian Church of Elmira to employ Gretchen Duffy to serve as the new Communications Administrator.

Camp Whitman Director Bryan Muecke and I have been working on insurance coverage since GuideOne told us they would not renew our policy. Which leads to the following warning:

#### Insurance warning for churches!

The Presbytery and several churches in our presbytery have had their insurance coverage cancelled recently, sometimes with sketchy pretexts. While the cancellations are mostly with GuideOne, all congregations should review their policies and update them. In general, the issues have been about building coverage rather than the liability components. This is a national problem across all denominations. There are a number of ways to reconfigure policies to decrease the hardship, including decreasing coverage on the building to less than replacement costs, dropping coverage on expensive items like stained glass windows or organs, or adjusting coverage amounts, all of which should be discussed with your agent. We recommend that you review your insurance now, even if you don't anticipate issues at this point. "You never know."

### Synod of the Northeast 2024 Biennial Meeting Outcomes October 25-26, 2022

Attendees: RE Judy Mellgard, TE Michelle Serra, RE Rob Anderson, TE Aaron Frank

The Synod Assembly was a time of both business and friendly engagement with Presbyterians from across the region. A few highlights:

- RE Lisa Baker from the Presbytery of Southern New England and member of the MLK Jr. Community Presbyterian Church of Springfield, MA was elected Moderator.
- Rev. Sue Smith from the Coastlands Presbytery, currently serving as a Trustee to the Presbytery, was voted Moderator-Elect.
- Rev. Nancy Talbot from the Presbytery of New York presented her report regarding the extensive work of the Synod PJC and the conclusion of the work of the AC for Susquehanna Valley Presbytery.
- Rev. Dr. Sandawna Gaulman Ashley, Transitional Synod Leader, presented her report on her leadership over the last 2 years. She has focused on improving communication with Presbyteries, training new Presbytery Leaders, supporting the Discernment Team, cultivating shared ministry conversations between presbyteries and reframing the Synod's Missional narrative.
- Rev. Gregory Simpson was elected Treasurer of the Synod for a 4 year term. He is pastor of Nauraushaun Presbyterian Church in Pearl River, NY, in Hudson River Presbytery.
- Synod received the Discernment Team's Year 2 report. Key learnings and recommendations included: enhancing the Grant program where financially possible, further supporting the Clergy Coaching Network, the Early Ministry Institute, Robert Washington Scholars program, and the Small Church Residency program. Broadly, the Discernment Team encourages Synod to dedicate time and resources to supporting smaller presbyteries (and their churches) wherever possible and to help foster collaboration between presbyteries through regular regional gatherings. Their final report will be received in November 2025, during a special called meeting of the Synod

- Synod passed its budget for 2025. As part of the budget a \$0.15 increase to Per Capita was approved.
- A resolution to endorse, support, and work together in Christian partnership the, approved, GA Resolution (RSG-05) "Addressing Diversity, Equity, Inclusion, and the Realities of Hispanic Latino-a-e Ministry" within the Synod of the Northeast, was passed.
- Joyous worship was shared throughout the Assembly, and lest you think that Synod Assembly is just a work event, an evening of Karaoke and Talent was shared on Friday.

Prior to the Synod Assembly a "Pre-Assembly" gathering was offered, entitled, Exploring Culture, Identity, and Faith to Confront Racism, presented by Rev. Molly Casteel and Chrisstine Saxman. Through lecture and small group discussion attendees studied the PCUSA policy, 'Facing Racism.' The workshop provided "frameworks and tools for you to understand how culture and identity impact how racism permeates your community whether you perceive it or not. Fundamental to our approach is that everyone will thrive when all are liberated." RE Virginia Champlin, TE Marjorie Ackerman, TE Sabrina Slater and TE Aaron Frank attended this workshop.
