

Guest Speaker, Rev. Dr. Glen Bell "The Gift of One's Self: Identity, Belonging, and Purpose"


Join us as we talk about identity, belonging, and purpose in ways that will invite participants toward their own reflection and spiritual growth.

Washington, DC—Arrabon Experiential Learning Trip



Event Details

The Calvin Institute of Christian Worship is excited to partner with Arrabon, a spiritual formation ministry that equips Christ-followers to actively and creatively pursue reconciliation and racial healing in their communities, to offer three curated experiential learning trips to Montgomery, Alabama, Washington, DC, and El Paso, Texas.

This experiential learning trip is to Washington, DC, and is centered on The National Museum of African American History and Culture.

An Arrabon experiential learning trip guides communities into spaces of disintegration to hold a traumainformed space framed by our "Foundation of a Reconciling Community" workshop. The work of racial healing and reconciliation is often impacted by fear, anger, shame, and grief. During this experience, participants process these complex emotions to gain confidence in their ability to lead their communities as ambassadors of reconciliation.

Presbyterian Youth Triennium Event

This year the Presbyterian Church (USA) will welcome thousands of its high school age youth and their adult youth workers to Louisville, Kentucky for four days of worship, recreation, bible study, outreach, and faith formation all around the theme of, "As If We Were Dreaming". The event takes place from 28-31 July. A committee of eleven from five presbyteries met on January 26 and shared the following details:

- The Geneva Presbytery will combine with Genessee Valley, Susquehanna Valley. Northern New York, and Cayuga-Syracuse to send one large delegation.
- Transportation will be by bus and all the anticipated costs for the weekend are estimated to be between \$700 and \$800.
- This year, there will also be a program for young adults 18-25, due to the (Covid) cancellation of the 2022 event.


Walking labyrinth, Finger Labyrinths, Scripture and Sanctified Art Materials will be available for your reflection, prayer, and/or meditation.
